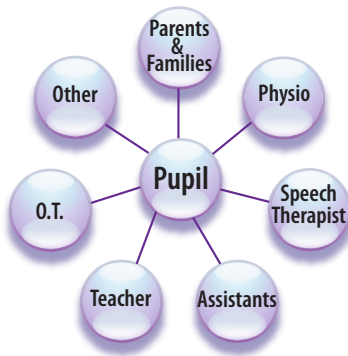


## Who are we?

## What we do

There are exciting and challenging opportunities for all pupils in the Primary School. These carefully planned opportunities enable pupils to develop an understanding of the world around them. Through the dynamic curriculum, we teach pupils how to learn, communicate, and manage their own behaviour and to make informed and appropriate choices. For some pupils, these skills are developed through a more academic curriculum based on the National Curriculum.

Pupils are taught in small groups according to their age and learning styles. Each class group is led by a teacher with the support of a Specialist Teaching Assistant and Teaching Assistant.

A range of teaching approaches are used to support pupils' learning and development such as:

- Group work
- 1:1 support
- The use of technology
- Educational visits
- Use of community resources
- Links with the community



## Curriculum

The curriculum and learning opportunities are based on a differentiated National Curriculum and is delivered through a cross curricular approach. Pupils are immersed in exciting and stimulating projects in a very practical way.

Our 'Rainbow Days' enrich the pupil's curriculum by providing a range of opportunities to enhance their learning through practical application of skills, meeting new people or visiting places of interest.
